#### April 26/27, 2014

It is time to make your reservations for the adult (18 years and over) Spring Rosemaling Seminar at Camp Norge. We will have three classes. The teachers are Carl Larsen, Mardella Ivers, and Sandra Cole.

We will be painting on a 12 inch scalloped rim plate. Carl is teaching a variation of Os on a white background. Mardella will teach a Numedal on a Williamsburg Blue background. Sandra Cole has kindly agreed to step in and teach Karen's beginners (advanced beginners) class, doing a wonderful Valdres on a Jo Sonja Sea Swirl background. Look on the Camp Norge Website for pictures of all three projects: <u>www.campnorge.org</u>. Mardella will teach a stroke class for those who wish to come early. More details with your supply list after you register.

Please make your bed reservation with me. I develop the list of who is in which room. You will pay for your bed when you arrive at Camp. It is not included in your class fee. Bring your current membership card. If you can't locate your membership card, bring the last issue of your Viking Magazine. It has your number in the address box. Members pay \$16.20 per night; guests pay \$27.00 for beds in the dorms, which includes 8% Placer County Occupancy Tax. Only members are allowed to stay in the main house and the cozy cabins. For people who want to room together, I need to receive the list of names with the first reservation. RV's are encouraged as we have a limited number of beds. Members pay \$20 per night for up to four people per RV. Guests pay \$32 per night for RV's. Camp has electrical and water, but no sewer hookups. Tents are \$15 for up to four people for members, \$20 for non members. No occupancy tax on RV's or tents. Pets are \$2 per night. Pets are not allowed in any of the buildings, pool area or sleeping rooms at any time.

Please include your full phone number, address and lodge name and number when registering. If you have e-mail, please include your e-mail address. It is so much faster and cheaper if I need to talk to you. The supply lists are available, and I will send them as I receive your registration form and check. **ABSOLUTELY NO E-MAIL**  **RESERVATION REQUESTS.** I need the check and registration form together. Be sure to send a self-addressed stamped envelope for your supply list and class confirmation information if you do not have e-mail. <u>I will</u> not be sending you a supply list unless you send me a self-addressed, stamped envelope or your e-mail address with your registration form. I use Microsoft Word running on an XP program and all attachments will be attached from that program.

The cost of the seminar will be \$87 for registration which includes the class and wood piece all base coated and ready to go, hall rent and clean up, and the meals. There will be \$25 cancellation fee for any cancellations, but absolutely no cancellations after April 1st. It is difficult for people on the waiting list to take your place if they do not have at least three weeks to make their plans, so please be thoughtful. Melanie Souza will again do our cooking. The cost for food for the weekend is included in the \$87 registration fee. The food includes breakfast, lunch and dinner on Saturday and breakfast and lunch on Sunday. You were so very generous and cooperative with the cookies last time. I do so appreciate that. We will ask just one class to bring cookies, and will rotate those classes each time. The information will be on your supply list.

## **Instant Potato Norwegian Lefse**

#### Ingredients:

- 1. 4 cups potato flakes
- 2. 4 tablespoons sugar
- 3. 3 cups water
- 4. 2 1/2 cups milk
- 5. 1 1/2 cups butter
- 6. 3 teaspoons salt
- 7. 2 -3 cups flour (enough to make a rolling dough)

#### Directions

- In a large saucepan or pot, bring the water to boil and add the milk, butter, sugar, and salt. When the milk has come to a boil, add the potato flakes and stir until smooth. Pour the potatoes into a large bowl and refrigerate.
- HEAT electric lefse griddle or electric skillet to highest temperature setting. DO NOT GREASE GRIDDLE OR SKILLET.
- 3. When ready to make the lefse, take out 2 cups of potatoes at a time and add 1 to 1 1/2 cups of flour and stir until it becomes a workable dough. Take a small hand full of dough. ROLL out dough on well-floured pastry cloth until paper thin (see tip). With lefse stick or long spatula, transfer to heated griddle.
- 4. Bake 1 minute or until brown spots appear on bottom surface. Turn. Bake other side 30 to 45 seconds. Place baked lefse between damp cloth towels to prevent it from drying out. Continue to cook until the potato dough is gone. Any leftover cooked lefse may be refrigerate and used for about 3-5 more days.
- 5. Cool completely before storing in plastic bag.
- SERVE by spreading with butter. Sprinkle with sugar and cinnamon or brown sugar.

**TIP** For best results, use rolling pin covered with pastry stocking. Flour rolling pin and pastry cloth before rolling out each lefse. To freeze, wrap lefse in plastic and foil. Seal tightly. ## Norway celebrate Bicentenary of its

## Constitution (VG/Aftenposten)

February 16th marks the official start of the 200th anniversary of Norway's constitution and its independence from Denmark.

At the beginning of 1814 Norway was still under Danish rule. At the end of the year, Norway was in a union with Sweden. In the meantime, however, the Norwegian people and a poor, small country grasped the opportunity that arose when the major national powers were settling things after the Napoleon Wars. The Norwegians declared themselves free and independent, and passed one of the most liberal constitutions at the time.

On February 16, 1814, Danish Prince Christian Frederik and Norwegian lords met at Eidsvoll. There they decided to form a national committee that would give Norway its own constitution.

Prince Christian Fredrik realized that he would have to be chosen by the people's representatives if he would become a Norwegian king. Being an heir to the throne was simply not enough, and the Norwegian people had successfully taken over the power and changed the country's entire political framework. The committee at Eidsvoll ensured that the focus was on the individual and his/her own rights in the constitution that was written in 1814. They looked to the U.S. and France for inspiration, which also meant a revolutionary new look on the citizens' role in society, human rights and division of power.

Today, Norway's constitution is the world's second oldest acting constitution. Only the U.S.

constitution is older and still in effect. That alone says a lot about the men at Eidsvoll's capability to look ahead of their own time.

The 200th anniversary of Norway's constitution officially started on Sunday, and will be celebrated with different events and exhibitions throughout 2014. For the full program, see the government's website dedicated to the

#### **Tubfrim Winner Announced**

Tuesday, January 7, 2014 was a lucky day for Vegas Viking Lodge 6-152 in Las Vegas, Nevada. The lodge was the winner of the Tubfrim drawing to give away a ticket to Norway, worth up to \$1,000. Their postcard was drawn from among 1,229 other cards. With one card for every pound sent to Norway that means that Sons of Norway sent at least 1,229 pounds of stamps to Tubfrim in 2013.

Sons of Norway members have been an integral part of Tubfrim's success since 1986. Lodges and individuals participate by clipping used stamps and sending them to Tubfrim, which sells them to dealers and collectors.

Originally the money raised went to help children afflicted by tuberculosis. Since tuberculosis is no longer the threat to health that it once was, today the proceeds from the resale of stamps helps improve the quality of life for children and youth with disabilities and special needs. Sons of Norway members are the largest contributor outside of Norway to Tubfrim's efforts, sending nearly 30% of all stamps collected. While helping children is a great motivation for our members to participate, there is a special incentive to say "thank you". For every pound of stamps collected, the member or lodge can enter a drawing, held in mid-January every year, to win a round trip ticket to Norway, worth up to \$1,000.
