

Fish on the grill

Ingredients: 1 lb. fish fillet (fresh or frozen) 2 Tbsp. margarine or butter 1/4 cup lemon juice 1 Tbsp. parsley, chopped 1 tsp. dill 1 tsp. salt

1/4 tsp. pepper paprika1 medium onion, thinly sliced

<u>Recipe</u>

• On 4 large buttered squares of heavyduty aluminum foil, place equal amounts of fish.

• In small saucepan, melt margarine; add lemon juice, parsley, dill, salt and pepper.

• Pour equal amounts over fish.

Sprinkle with paprika; top with onion slices.
Wrap foil securely around fish, leaving space for fish to expand.

• Grill 5 to 7 minutes on each side or until fish flakes with fork.

• Refrigerate leftovers.
