Trollkrem - Troll Cream

Inspired by a classic Scandinavian recipe, this unusual-sounding dessert is actually very simple to make, and much more delicious than it sounds! Using tart lingonberries, Karen's creamy dessert is worth a try.

<u>Ingredients</u>

3 egg whites

6 Tbsp. of lingonberry jam, **or** an 8 oz / 225 g jar of preserved lingonberries in syrup, drained *50 grams / 1/4 cup granulated sugar (*use only if using unsweetened lingonberries)

Directions

Whisk the egg whites in a mixer with half of the lingonberries (that have been drained) or half of the jam. Whisk until the egg whites are light and fluffy.

Add the sugar, if using, and whisk until the egg white mixture holds soft peaks.

Swirl the remaining lingonberries or preserve through the dessert and serve in small bowls or spoon into a large serving bowl. Eat within 24 hours, as the egg whites start to collapse if no sugar is used.

 - After our Norwegian prayer, we lined up for today's lunch hosted by the lodge. With a beach theme in mind, we had hot dogs, kraut, mac & cheese, green salad, fruit salad, corn on the cob, tons of snacks & dessert. And to our

wonderful surprise, the Norwegian waffle fairy appeared with all the trimmings. 😂 Yummmm

 - Today's language lesson was focused on Norwegian money.
- Today's Program Norwegian Money Hosted by John & Sylvi Olsen THANK YOU Both! 😣
 - o In today's world, Norway mostly uses some sort of card ie atm, credit, bank, visa etc. But before.....
 - The Norwegian currency is the Kroner (NOK). 1 NOK is divided into 100 øre (cents). Coins are calculated in the following denominations: 1 krone, 5 kroner, 10 kroner and 20 kroner. The krone, plural kroner, has existed since 2012. The name translates to English as "crown".
 - Latest history In 1875, coins were introduced (some dated 1874) in denominations of 10 and 50 øre and 1 and 10 kroner. These coins also bore the denomination in the previous currency, as 3, 15, and 30 <u>skillings</u> and 2½ specidaler. Between 1875 and 1878, the new coinage was introduced in full denominations of 1, 2, 5, 10, 25, and 50 øre and 1, 2, and 10 kroner. The 1, 2, and 5 øre were struck in bronze; the 10, 25, and 50 øre and 1 and 2 kroner, in silver; and the 10 and 20 kroner, in gold.
 - The last gold coins were issued in 1910; silver was replaced by cupro-nickel from 1920. Between 1917 and 1921, iron temporarily replaced bronze. 1917 also saw the last issuance of 2-kroner coins.
 - In 1963, 5-kroner coins were introduced. Production of 1- and 2-øre coins ceased in 1972. The following year, the size of the 5-øre coin was reduced; production of the denomination ceased in 1982, along with minting of the 25 øre. Ten-kroner coins were introduced in 1983. In 1992, the last 10-øre coins were minted.
 - Between 1994 and 1998, a new coinage was introduced, consisting of 50 øre, 1, 5, 10, and 20 kroner. These are the only coins which are currently legal tender, with the exception of the 50-øre coin which was <u>withdrawn</u> on 1 May 2012. It was withdrawn because it was no longer circulating as an ordinary coin used for payment.^[2] However, banks in Norway will still exchange 50-øre coins for higher values until 2022.
